

Children

BCNC provides high-quality dual language Chinese and English early education for children and child care for working families. At BCNC, preschool children receive nationally accredited early education, school-age children engage with arts after school and in the summer, and Chinese-speaking family child care providers are trained to serve immigrant families.



Adults

BCNC provides immigrant adults with a full continuum of English instruction and multiple pathways to post-secondary and occupational training. Adults gain English and workforce development skills through English for Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL) for College and Career Readiness classes, the ESOL for Customer Service Job Training program, ESOL for Parents and Caregivers as well as advising and tutoring. BCNC also provides digital literacy education and citizenship classes to adults new to the United States.

Youth

To prepare for life beyond high school, BCNC provides youth with opportunities to grow in education, workforce readiness, and leadership. High school youth who college, are matched with mentors and workforce development and employment

are the first in their family to apply for 100 Youth and participate in workshops and college tours. BCNC also provides youth with opportunities throughout the year.



Creating Pathways for Families

BCNC builds high-functioning families and supports immigrant families to cope with challenging issues. BCNC believes all families have both the assets and the capacity to thrive, and partners with them to set and accomplish their goals. For Asian immigrant families, BCNC provides linguistically accessible and culturally appropriate mental health support services, case management, family education, workshops, and counseling.

BCNC served 532 family members



PARENTHOOD AND ME

BCNC launched the Parenthood and Me program to promote the wellbeing of expectant parents, improve postpartum mental health of Chinese immigrant mothers, and reduce stigma to mental health. For new families in Boston and Quincy, BCNC provides Parenthood Health Series, Infant Massage classes, and Mother's Wellness Groups thanks to funding from Tufts Medical Center and the Asian Healthcare Foundation.

Creating Pathways for Communities

BCNC believes arts, creativity, and culture promote the health and wellness of communities. BCNC creates opportunities where community members build strong connections to others and develop their own ability to act.

Through Pao Arts Center, thousands participate in events, performances, exhibitions, and classes where attendees experience the intersection of arts and well-being.

Through the Quincy Family Fun Fair and Run, hundreds of children and families gathered for fun and bonding.

Through collaborations including the AAPI Empowerment Network, Project RISE, and Chinatown HOPE, BCNC builds up community health and well-being.






YOUTH INSTALL ART MURALS




