For more than 50 years, BCNC has been providing new immigrants, especially Asians, with the support and resources they need to thrive in the United States. With deep roots in Boston's Chinatown neighborhood, BCNC now serves people from three locations in Greater Boston. Its holistic, family-centered programs reach 13,000 children, youth, and adults each year, setting them up for success in school, work, and life. BCNC also builds vibrant communities through Pao Arts Center, along with its collaborations and research.

Growing Our Impact

This year, BCNC developed key strategic priorities to respond to emerging needs and build on our greatest strength - our multilingual, culturally competent staff. Your support made the following possible:

Strengthen the Mental Health of the Asian Community - We completed the Chinese translation of the Mental Health First Aid course in partnership with the National Council for Mental Wellbeing and launched new community wellness initiatives and collaboratives to address problem gambling, thanks to funding from the Massachusetts Department of Public Health.

Support Evolving Demographics and Needs of Our Community - We grew our outreach efforts and expanded youth programs and family services in Quincy. We also opened new Family Child Care homes in Quincy to support working families.

Strengthen BCNC's Talent Pipeline and Systems of Staff Support - Your support provided staff professional development on implicit bias and traumainformed care and developed a transparent staff evaluation system.

Strengthen BCNC's Infrastructure - The implementation of new technologies, renovations of six early education classrooms, the new roof top at our Boston site, and a new dedicated youth space in Quincy was made possible by our funders and donors.

Meet Elvira, who immigrated from Russia in 2016 to reunite with her daughters. As a former ophthalmologist, she pursued a similar path in the U.S. but needed to improve her English to better serve patients and receive required certifications. Through

BCNC's Adult Education classes, Elvira strengthened her English and digital skills, passed the U.S. citizenship test, and advanced her career. She also gained community with her fellow classmates. Today, she works as an ophthalmologist technician at Newton-Wellesley Hospital.

Celebrating 50 years of Early Education & Care

Since its founding in 1974, BCNC Acorn Center for Early Education and Care has provided full-day, dual-language education and care in Chinese and English for 5,000 children aged 15 months to 5 years. BCNC Acorn is nationally accredited and licensed and contracted by the state to provide care to children from low-income families, and expanded to offer pre-kindergarten education in partnership with Boston Public Schools.

On September 28th, 2024, BCNC Acorn Center for Early Education & Care celebrated its 50th anniversary. Current and former staff and participants, as well as community partners reunited to reflect on half a century of impactful early education and dedicated service to immigrant families.

"I've seen the challenges faced by immigrant children evolve significantly. Initially, language barriers were the primary concern, but over time, I've observed the need for more holistic support that addresses not only language but also social integration and independence."

Over the past decade, BCNC has:


- Taught hundreds of adult immigrants through five levels of English classes.

- Welcomed 3,000 guests to our annual Family Fun Fair.


